

Dental Implant Treatment Process

1

First consultation

Absolutely obligation free information session and initial clinical examination to find out if dental implants are right for you. If referred by another dentist please bring your referral letter and any x-rays. Your individual circumstances will be taken in to account and Dr Kassim will discuss all of the treatment options that may be available for your situation. Clinical photos and x-rays may be taken.

Dr Kassim is renowned for his friendly chair-side manner and is happy to answer any questions you may have. A referral may be given at this appointment for additional 3D imaging x-rays if required.



2

Finalisation of treatment plan

Final discussion of the intended treatment plan. A specific written quote will be given, if you are in a health fund this quote can be used to determine how much out of pocket expense will be incurred.

Surgery

Your implant will be inserted. Dr Kassim goes to great lengths to ensure this is done as gently as possible to minimise any post-operative pain and discomfort.

Confirmation of integration/ exposure surgery

After a suitable healing period (usually about 12 weeks) the implant will be tested to ensure successful integration with your jaw bone. Sometimes a small soft tissue surgical procedure may also be necessary to get the gum ready for your new tooth.



4

10 day review

This is a quick check to make sure all is well and to remove stitches. Your implant will then be left to heal for a further period. For most patients this is typically 12 weeks.



6

Implant impression

If you have been referred by another dentist, Dr Kassim will liaise fully with the referring dentist when you are ready for you new tooth/crown. Dr Kassim or your referring dentist will take an impression (mould) of the implant to make the new crown.



7

Prosthesis connection

Attachment of crown/tooth to your implant/s. Dr Kassim will advise you on how to look after your implant to ensure your investment will last for many years to come!
